14 15 16	IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-TWO
17 18 19	RESOLUTION, Proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine Prohibiting Bond Issues of Less than \$2,000,000.
20 21 22	Constitutional amendment. RESOLVED: Two-thirds of each branch of the Legislature concurring, that the follow-ing amendment to the Constitution of Maine be proposed:
23	Constitution, Art.IX, §14-F is enacted to read:
24 25 26 27 28	Section 14-F. Bond issue of less than two million dollars. The Legislature may not create any debt or liabil- ity on behalf of the State, through authorization of the issuance of bonds under Section 14 for any single purpose, which is less than two million dollars.
29 30 31 32	Constitutional referendum procedure; form of question; effective date. Resolved: That the city aldermen, town selectmen and plantation assessors of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and

1 plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for 2 holding a statewide election, at the next general election 3 in the month of November following passage of this resolu-4 tion, to vote upon the ratification of the amendment pro-5 posed in this resolution by voting upon the following ques-6 tion:

7 "Shall the Constitution of Maine be amended to prohibit 8 bond issues of less than \$2,000,000?"

9 The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate 10 their choice by a cross or check mark placed within the cor-responding square below the word "Yes" or "No". The ballots 11 12 13 shall be received, sorted, counted and declared in open 14 ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for Members 15 16 of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns 17 and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are in 18 favor of the amendment, the Governor shall proclaim that 19 fact without delay and the amendment shall become part of 20 the Constitution on the date of the proclamation.

21 Secretary of State shall prepare ballots. 22 Resolved: That the Secretary of State shall prepare and 23 furnish each city, town and plantation all ballots. to returns and copies of this resolution necessary to carry out 24 25 the purposes of this referendum.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this constitutional resolution is to prohibit bond issues of less than \$2,000,000. This prohibition will prevent needless proliferation of bond issues for unusually small amounts.

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
