The Department of Transportation is authorized and directed to conduct a study of the cost and feasibility of installing safety barriers along the walkways of the Memorial Bridge over the Kennebec River in Augusta. The department is further directed to report the results of this study, along with any necessary legislation in final draft form, to the First Regular Session of the 111th Legislature.

31	This bill would direct the Department of Transportation	

to conduct a study of the cost and feasibility of installing safety barriers along the walkways of the Memorial Bridge in Augusta. These barriers would be used to help prevent persons from trying to jump from the bridge, which is a frequent problem at the present time.
