Sec. 2. 28 MRSA §56, as repealed and replaced by PL 1975, c. 741, §4 and as amended by PL 1975, c. 771, §300, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:

At the end of each fiscal year the State Controller is authorized to transfer from the General Fund an amount not to exceed the excess of the actual revenues received over the budgeted estimated revenues resulting from the sales of alcoholic beverages until the total working capital advance of \$5,000,000 is achieved. Notwithstanding this section, the total General Fund revenues from all sources must exceed the budgeted estimated revenues each year by at least the excess revenues produced by the sale of alcoholic beverages for this transfer to be implemented.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

The last increase in working capital was granted by Public Law 1963, chapter 364 and due to the increased cost of merchandise since that date, it is now necessary to again increase the working capital of the commission in order to adequately maintain inventory.
