| Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:  |
| 22 MRSA §3778 is enacted to read:  |
| §3778. Work Incentive Demonstration Program  |
| Nothing in this chapter may be construed to limit or prevent any decision by the Commissioner of Human Services, made pursuant to the Work Incentive Demonstration Program under the United States Social Security Act, Title IV-C, Section 445, as amended. Whenever any such decision appears to be of interest to either the Commissioner of Labor or the Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services, or both, |

- the Commissioner of Human Services shall seek the advice of
   either or both in carrying out the decision.
- The 3 commissioners shall evaluate and report to the 111th Legislature on or before January 1, 1984, the extent to which the Work Incentive Demonstration Program has carried out this chapter.
- 7 This section shall remain in effect until October 1, 8 1984.

## 9 Statement of Fact

The State has undertaken 3 complementary efforts within the past year to address welfare employment issues.

First, the Commissioner of Human Services, in cooperation with the Commissioner of Labor and the Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services, convened a statewide Work Opportunities Committee which met for 9 months to examine and make recommendations concerning employment, education and training opportunities for Aid to Families with Dependent Children recipients.

Second, the 110th Legislature enacted Public Law 1981, chapter 512, "An Act to Establish and Coordinate Training, Education and Employment Programs for Recipients of Aid to Families with Dependent Children."

Third, in early October, 1981, the Governor applied to the United States Department of Health and Human Services to participate in a 3-year Work Incentive Demonstration Program. This program was authorized in amendments to the Social Security Act, included in the Budget Reconciliation Act passed by Congress in August, 1981. Maine was one of 26 states to apply. Maine's application was approved in late November, 1981.

The purpose of this bill is to ensure that there is consistency in the language of the state law and the federal law. The goals of both laws are virtually identical.
