9 Amend the Bill by striking out everything after the 10 enacting clause and inserting in its place the following:

'30 MRSA §2151, sub-§2, ¶K is enacted to read:

K. Providing for the establishment and policing of parking spaces designated for handicapped persons. A municipality with off-street public parking areas may set aside an adequate number of these spaces for use by handicapped persons. A municipality with on-street public parking spaces may set aside an adequate number of these spaces in appropriate locations for use by handicapped persons. There shall be adjacent to and visible from each handicapped parking space a posted sign consisting of a profile view of a wheelchair with occupant in white on a blue background and bearing the following warning: "Handicapped Parking: Special Plate Required. Unauthorized vehicles are subject to a fine." Any vehicle parked in a parking space designated by a municipality as a handicapped parking space that does not bear a special registration plate or placard issued under Title 29, section 252, or a similar plate issued by another state, shall be cited for a penalty not to exceed \$25 unless otherwise established by local ordinance."

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment allows, rather than requires, municipalities to provide for adequate parking spaces in off-street public parking areas and on-street public parking sections for vehicles of handicapped persons only. Application of this bill eliminates requirements for owners of private

off-street parking areas from the bill. Municipalities will identify spaces designated for handicapped parking by posting a uniform sign. Unauthorized vehicles occupying designated spaces for the handicapped in municipal parking areas will be cited for a fine. Penalty amounts are determined either by local ordinance or by imposing a fine not to exceed \$25. This amendment eliminates the towing penalty.
