8 9	Amend the Bill in section 1 by striking out all of subsection 4 and inserting in its place the following:
10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17	'4. Especially trained guide dog trainer; access to public facilities; responsibilities. An especially trained guide dog trainer, while engaged in the actual training process and activities of guide dogs, shall have the same rights, privileges and responsibilities with respect to access to public facilities as are applicable to a blind, visually handicapped or otherwise physically disabled person.'
18 19	Further amend the Bill by inserting after section 3 the following:
20 21	Sec. 4. 22 MRSA §3601, sub-§1, $\P\PA-1$ and A-2 are enacted to read:
22 23 24	A-1. "Deaf person" means a person whose sense of hearing is nonfunctional for the purpose of ordinary communication.
25 26 27	A-2. "Hearing impaired person" means a person whose sense of hearing is defective, but still functional, with or without amplification.
28 29	Further amend the bill in section 4, in that part designated "§3611." by adding at the end the following under-

'The provisions of rights, and penalties for denial thereof, as specified in this subchapter, are not intended to abrogate any actions or penalties provided for violation of human rights, as specified in the Maine Human Rights Act, Title 5, chapter 337.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 765, L.D. 1823

Further amend the Bill in section 4, in that part designated "§3612.", in subsection 3, by striking out in the 4th line (page 3, line 7 in L.D.) the underlined word "harness" and inserting in its place the underlined words 'collar and leash'

Further amend the Bill in section 4, in that part designated " $\S3612$ ", in subsection 3 by adding at the end the following underlined sentence:

When the deaf or hearing impaired person is accompanied by a guide dog, he shall also carry a card, issued by the Bureau of Rehabilitation, which states that the dog is a especially trained guide dog, and cites Title 22, sections 3611 and 3612 as allowing for access by the person and his dog to streets, public places and public conveyances.

Further amend the Bill in section 4, in that part designated "§3612", by striking out all of subsection 4 and inserting in its place the following:

4. Especially trained guide dog trainer; access to public facilities; responsibilities. An especially trained hearing ear dog trainer, while engaged in the actual training of hearing ear dogs, shall have the same rights, privileges and responsibilities with respect to access to public facilities as are applicable to a deaf or hearing impaired person.

Further amend the Bill in section 4, in that part desed "§3614", in the first line of the 2nd paragraph ignated "§3614", in the first line of the 2nd paragraph (page 3, line 38 in L.D.) by striking out the underlined word "harness" and inserting in its place the underlined words 'collar and leash'

Further amend the Bill by renumbering section 4 to be 32 section 5.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment adds that the guide dog trainers must be especially trained guide dog trainers. It also modifies the term "harness" to be "collar and leash," since hearing ear dogs do not wear harnesses.

1 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 765, L.D. 1823

It provides a cross-reference to the Maine Human Rights Act, and requires the deaf or hearing impaired persons accompanied by a guide dog to carry a card to inform others of their rights to enter public places or conveyances with their guide dogs.

Finally, the amendment adds the definition of "deaf person" and "hearing impaired person" to the chapter on the deaf and hearing impaired persons.
