Any student who, upon the conclusion of his professional education, including, if applicable, internship, residency and obligated public health service, elects to serve as a general, family, pediatric or veterinary practitioner in an underserved rural geographic area in the State shall be forgiven 20% of the indebtedness, as determined in subsection 1-A, for each of the first 5 years of that service.
20 21 22 23 24	1-C. Determination. The Commissioner of Human Services shall determine underserved rural areas for general, family or pediatric services. The Commissioner of Agriculture, Food and Rural Resources shall determine underserved rural areas for veterinary services.
25 26	Sec. 2. Retroactivity. This Act shall be applied retroactively to July 1, 1981.

28 29 30 31	This amendment has a future cost that is undeterminable at this time. The cost will depend upon the number of students that elect to serve in the State and qualify for the forgiveness.
