15 16 17	IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-TWO
18 19 20	AN ACT Relating to the Publication of a Consolidated Map of the State.
21 22 23	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
24 25 26 27	Whereas, at least one publishing company has announced that it plans to produce and market a map similar to the one that the Department of Transportation is currently charged with producing; and
28 29	Whereas, this legislation is vitally needed to avoid costly duplication; and

1 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these 2 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Consti-3 tution of Maine and require the following legislation as 4 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public 5 peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

6 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

7 23 MRSA §4206, sub-§1, ¶L, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 8 505, §5, is amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to 9 read:

10	Notwithstanding this paragraph or any other provision
11	of law, the Department of Transportation shall not be
12	required to produce a consolidated map of the State if
13	a similar map is produced and marketed by a private
14	publishing company.

15 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in16 the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

18 At least one publishing company has announced that it 19 plans to produce and market a similar map which it will distribute throughout the State. The map will be marketed at a similar price as the map that the Department of Transporta-20 21 tion is charged with producing. This company has pledged to 22 make maps available to the Maine Publicity Bureau and to 23 24 other state agencies free-of-charge so long as the maps are distributed free to potential tourists, thereby, eliminating 25 the need for the Department of Transportation to produce a 26 27 map.
