struction work in progress shall not be included in a utility's rate base nor be allowed as an expense for rate-making purposes until, and not before, that construction is actually providing service to consumers.

Statement of Fact

Recently, for the first time, the Public Utilities Commission allowed a utility company to include "construction work in progress" charges in its customer billing. This was for investment in the Seabrook Plant and represented an immediate increase in utility rates because of a questionable company investment.

Several states, including New Hampshire, Kansas, Missouri and Montana have enacted laws prohibiting the inclusion of these charges until construction is completed and plants are operating.

This bill would do the same.

In 1982, the Public Utilities Commission will have before it several rate increase requests which will also include construction work in progress charges for plants many years away from operating.

Maine ratepayers need to be protected from these additional burdens. The Public Utilities Commission must be given clear instructions on this issue.
