- 10 'AN ACT to Provide Immunity from Liability for those Report-11 ing Abuse of Incapacitated or Dependent Adults.'
- 12 Further amend the bill by striking out everything after 13 the enacting clause and inserting in its place the follow-14 ing:
- 15 'Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §3477 is enacted to read:
- 16 §3477. Immunity from liability

1. Reporting and proceedings. Any allopathic or osteopathic physician, intern, medical examiner, physician's 17 18 assistant, dentist, chiropractor, podiatrist, registered or 19 licensed practical nurse, Christian Science practitioner, 20 21 nursing or boarding home administrator, social worker, 22 homemaker, home health aide, medical or social service work-23 er, psychologist, pharmacist, physical therapist, speech therapist, occupational therapist, mental health profes-sional, member of the clergy, law enforcement official or 24 25 coroner who, while acting in his professional capacity, knows or has reasonable cause to suspect that an incapaci-tated or dependent adult has been abused, neglected or exploited, and is reporting this condition in good faith, or 26 27 28 29 who participates in a related adult protection investigation or proceeding, is immune from any civil liability that might 30 31 32 otherwise result from these actions.

2. Presumption of good faith. In a proceeding regard ing immunity from liability, there shall be a rebuttable
presumption of good faith.

2 Department of Human Services shall report to the joint 3 standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction 4 over health and institutional services on or before January 5 15, 1983. The report shall identify the number of com-6 plaints received by the department, the number of investiga-7 tions made as a result of these complaints and the personnel 8 and resources used to respond to these complaints.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

10 This amendment provides immunity from liability for 11 those persons listed who report or participate in a proceed-12 ing related to a reported, known or suspected case of abuse, 13 neglect or exploitation of incapacitated or dependent 14 adults.

15 It also requires a report to the committee of the 16 Legislature having jurisdiction over health and institu-17 tional services.
