1 Sec. 2. 10 MRSA §1003, sub-§11, 2nd ¶, as enacted by 2 PL 1981, c. 476, §2, is amended by adding after the first 3 sentence a new sentence to read:

In the case of medical office buildings, the requirements
 regarding minimum square footage and new jobs in this sub section do not apply.

## Sec. 3. 10 MRSA §1003, sub-§11, as enacted by PL 1981, c. 476, §2, is amended by adding after the 2nd paragraph a new paragraph to read:

"Medical office building" means any building which is used 10 11 primarily for the delivery of health services directly to the public by practicing health care professionals licensed 12 under Title 32, or for purposes associated with and 13 appropriate to the delivery of health services or for purposes 14 necessary to or associated with the operation 15 of health а 16 care facility.
