15 AN ACT Concerning Look-alike Drugs.
16

17 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

18 Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §110I, sub-§§19 and 20 are enacted
19 to read:

20 19. "Imitation scheduled drug," a substance that is
21 not a scheduled drug and which was not obtained by valid
22 medical prescription, but which, by dosage unit appearance
23 or by representations made, would lead a reasonable person
24 to believe that the substance was a scheduled drug.

25 In determining whether the appearance of a dosage unit of an
26 imitation scheduled drug would lead a reasonable person to
27 believe the substance was a scheduled drug, the court may
28 consider, but is not limited to considering, the following:

1 A. In the case of a substance in tablet, capsule or
2 other solid form, whether the size, shape and color are
3 substantially similar to that of a specific scheduled
4 drug, and in the case of a substance in powdered or
5 liquid form, whether the color, consistency and appear-
6 ance are substantially similar to that of a specific
7 scheduled drug;

8 B. Whether the markings on each dosage unit are sub-
9 stantially similar to those on a specific scheduled
10 drug; and

11 C. Whether the packaging of, or the labeling of a con-
12 tainer containing, the substance bears markings or
13 printed material substantially similar to that accompa-
14 nying or containing a specific scheduled drug.

15 20. "Dosage unit," that unit of measurement which is
16 equivalent to an average adult dose.

17 Sec. 2. 17-A MRSA §1116 is enacted to read:

18 §1116. Trafficking or furnishing imitation scheduled drugs

19 1. A person is guilty of trafficking in or furnishing
20 imitation scheduled drugs if he intentionally or knowingly
21 trafficks in or furnishes an imitation scheduled drug.

22 2. A person shall be presumed to be trafficking in or
23 furnishing imitation scheduled drugs if he intentionally or
24 knowingly possesses 100 or more tablets, capsules or other
25 dosage units of imitation scheduled drugs.

26 3. Trafficking in or furnishing imitation scheduled
27 drugs is a Class E crime, except that trafficking in or fur-
28 nishing imitation scheduled drugs by a person 18 years of
29 age or older to a person under 18 years of age is a Class D
30 crime.

31 4. Possession of fewer than 100 tablets, capsules or
32 other dosage units of imitation scheduled drugs constitutes
33 a civil violation for which a forfeiture of not more than
34 \$200 may be adjudged. An imitation scheduled drug is
35 declared to be contraband and may be seized by the State.

36 5. This section shall not apply to:

37 A. Law enforcement officers acting in the course and
38 legitimate scope of their employment;

1 This bill defines an imitation scheduled drug,
2 look-alike drug, as a substance that is not a scheduled drug
3 but which by dosage unit appearance, or representations made
4 by the seller, would lead a reasonable person to believe
5 that the substance was a scheduled drug. A placebo issued
6 pursuant to a valid medical prescription is not an imitation
7 scheduled drug.

8 Trafficking in or furnishing imitation scheduled sub-
9 stances is made a Class E crime. Trafficking includes manu-
10 facturing. If the seller is 18 years old or older and the
11 buyer is under 18 years of age, the offense is elevated to a
12 Class D crime. The bill also creates a presumption that a
13 person is trafficking in or furnishing imitation scheduled
14 drugs if he intentionally or knowingly possesses 100 or more
15 of these drugs. Possession of fewer than 100 of these drugs
16 is a civil violation, for which a fine may be imposed. The
17 bill declares imitation scheduled drugs to be contraband,
18 thus permitting them to be seized.

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
