20 21 22 23 24 25 26	On December 11, 1981, the United States Congres enacted a continuing resolution which cut the level of funding for the Work Incentive Program for fiscal year 1982 b 33% from the funding level authorized in last August's Federal Budget Reconciliation Act. This translates into a 37 cut in the federal funds for Maine's Work Incentive Program for fiscal year 1982, from \$1,956,088 to \$1,238,632.
27 28 29 30 31 32	During the first quarter of fiscal year 1982, the Department of Human Services and the Department of Laborexpended a total of \$544,615 of which 10% was state funds. These expenditures were based on the assumption that Main would receive the amount of federal funds authorized in August.

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authorized for fiscal year 1982 will be available. In addition, \$50,000 in state matching Work Incentive Program funds and \$138,752 in Federal Work Incentive Program funds brought forward from fiscal year 1981 will be available in the 2nd quarter. Thus, a total of \$228,752 will be available during the 2nd quarter compared with the \$544,615 expended during the first quarter.

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An emergency appropriation of \$230,000 would enable the Department of Human Services and the Department of Labor to operate the Work Incentive Program at the reduced level, \$324,000 per quarter, authorized by the United States Congress for the 3rd and 4th quarters of fiscal year 1982. Even with this appropriation, over 40 positions will have to be eliminated. Much of the emergency appropriation would be used to offset the costs of eliminating these positions. It should be noted that an emergency appropriation of \$164,000 would be required to close the program down.

conclusion, the Federal Government has left the State in the untenable position of not having enough money during the 2nd quarter of fiscal year 1982, either to close down the Work Incentive Program or to operate it at the reduced level authorized for the 3rd and 4th quarters of fiscal year 1982. A one-time emergency appropriation being requested of the 110th Maine Legislature in order to continue the Work Incentive Program at the reduced level. No matter what shape a federal welfare employment program will take, it is important for Maine to get into place, pieces and basic design which will be most responsive to its emergency appropriation of \$230,000 would citizens.
