9 10	Amend the Bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting in its place the following:
11	'Sec. 1. 1 MRSA §2601, sub-§4 is enacted to read:
12 13 14	4. Review of liquor price level. The level of the consumers tax to be levied in accordance with Title 28, section 451 shall be reviewed by January 31, 1983.
15 16 17	Sec. 2. 1 MRSA $\S2602$, as last amended by PL 1981, c. 449, $\S2$, is further amended by adding at the end a new sentence to read:
18 19 20	The leg slative committee having jurisdiction over the statutory prepare and submit its report by January 31, 1983.
21 22	Sec. 3. 28 MRSA §451, first ¶, last sentence, as amended by PL 1975, c. 646, is repealed.
23 24	Sec. 4. 28 MRSA $\S451$, last \P , as enacted by PL 1979, c. 307, is repealed.
25 26 27 28	Sec. 5 Statutory referendum procedure; submission at general election; form of question; effective date. This Act shall be submitted to the legal voters of the State of Maine at the next general election in the month of November

following passage of this Act. The city aldermen, town selectmen and plantation assessors of this State shall notify the inhabitants of their respective cities, towns and plantations to meet, in the manner prescribed by law for holding a statewide election, to vote on the acceptance or

rejection of this Act by voting on the following question:

2 "Shall the price of liquor sold at state and agency
 3 liquor stores be equalized throughout the State?"

The legal voters of each city, town and plantation shall vote by ballot on this question, and shall designate 5 their choice by a cross or check mark placed within a corresponding square below the word "Yes" or "No." The ballots shall be received, sorted, counted and declared in open 6 7 8 9 ward, town and plantation meetings and returns made to the 10 Secretary of State in the same manner as votes for members of the Legislature. The Governor shall review the returns 11 and, if it appears that a majority of the legal votes are in 12 favor of the Act, the Governor shall proclaim that fact without delay, and the Act shall become effective 30 days 13 14 15 after the date of the proclamation.

The Secretary of State shall prepare and furnish to each city, town and plantation all ballots, returns and copies of this Act necessary to carry out the purpose of this referendum.

20 FISCAL NOTE

The Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages estimates that if this measure becomes law, there will be a loss to the General Fund of \$2,500,000 in the next fiscal year.

Passage of this bill by the Legislature would also result in the costs of holding a statewide referendum.

26 STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment provides for a statutory referendum on the issue of equalization of liquor prices state wide. If approved by the voters this bill will:

- 30 1. Repeal the provisions in the present law allowing 31 operation of a single discount store; and
- 32 2. Provide for review by the 111th Legislature of the 33 price level of liquor determined in accordance with the 34 Revised Statutes, Title 28, section 451.
