21	17 MRSA §2003-A, sub-§2-A is enacted to read:

A person is guilty of public drinking on school premises if he drinks liquor on the premises of a public school knowing that he is not licensed or privileged to do so, unless he has been given permission to do so by the superintendent, with the approval of the school board. Violation of this subsection is a Class E crime.

This bill provides for a separate offense of public drinking on school premises. Under present law, a personal warning by a law enforcement officer is required before the crime is chargeable. Under this proposal, drinking on public school premises, unless with permission of the superintendent, is prohibited.
