RESOLVE	, Authorizing Ian M. Walker to Bring Suit Against the State.

lan M. Walker; authorized to sue the State of Maine. Resolved: That Ian M. Walker, owner and president of Spinney Creek Oyster Company, Inc., be authorized to bring suit against the State of Maine on behalf of that company. This action shall be to recover damages, if any, resulting from the failure of the Department of Marine Resources to follow the prescribed Maine Administrative Procedure Act regarding adjudicatory proceedings. This failure resulted in the loss by that company of a duly granted aquaculture lease to raise oysters in the York River, York, Maine.

This action, if authorized, is to be brought in the Superior Court for the County of York within one year from the passage of this resolve, against the State of Maine for damages, if any, and the conduct of this action shall be according to the practice of actions or proceedings between parties in the Superior Court. The liabilities of the parties and elements of damage, if any, shall be the same as liabilities and elements of damage as between individuals. In particular, the State waives, for both the State and its employees, immunity for judicial and quasi-judicial acts and

discretionary functions or duties. The summons issuing out of the Superior Court under the authority of this resolve and the complaint shall be served on the Secretary of State by attested copy by the sheriff or his deputies in any county of the State. The Attorney General is authorized and designated to appear, answer and defend this action.

Any judgment that may be recovered in this civil action shall be payable from the State Treasury on file process issued by the Superior Court, or, if applicable, the Supreme Judicial Court and costs may be taxed for Ian M. Walker and the Spinney Creek Oyster Company, Inc. if he recovers in the action, and his recovery shall not exceed \$300,000, including costs. Hearing thereon shall be before a justice, with or without jury; the justice to be the regularly scheduled justice presiding in the York County Superior Court when this matter is scheduled for trial.

## Statement of Fact

This resolve authorizes suit against the State to recover damages allegedly caused by the State.
