18	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
19	12 MRSA §6526 is enacted to read:
20	§6526. Molesting gear
21 22 23 24 25	It is unlawful for any person, except a marine patrol officer, the owner or a person having written permission from the owner, to intentionally tamper with, move, destroy or otherwise molest any fixed fishing gear that is set in a lawful manner.
26	STATEMENT OF FACT
27 28 29 30	Fixed fishing gear, such as stop seines and weirs, is commonly used for commercial fishing. The equipment is valuable and may trap thousands of dollars worth of fish at a time. If the gear is molested or destroyed by passing

boaters or other fishermen, it can result in severe economic
losses. This bill prohibits persons from intentionally
molesting or destroying the fixed fishing gear belonging to
another person.

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
