16 17 18	AN ACT to Provide for Special Warehouse Storage Facilities for Liquor.
19	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
20 21 22	Sec. 1. 28 MRSA §351, as last amended by PL 1977, c. 60, is further amended by adding after the 2nd sentence, a new sentence to read:
23 24 25 26 27 28 29 30 31	In the case of certificate of approval licensees operating special warehouse storage facilities within this State, com- plete records shall be kept and maintained upon the premise relating to all transactions conducted at the special ware- house storage facility, showing the date and amounts of all liquors received and from whom they were received, as well as the dates and amounts of all liquors shipped or withdrawn and the name of the person for whom such liquor was shipped or withdrawn.

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1 Sec. 2. 28 MRSA §604, as last amended by PL 1975, c. 2 741, is further amended by adding at the end 5 new para-3 graphs to read:

4 Notwithstanding the importation restrictions of sec-5 tions 1051 and 1052, the commission may issue certificates 6 liqof approval authorizing the direct importation of malt 7 uors, table wines or distilled spirits from suppliers locat-8 ed in foreign countries or states into special warehouse 9 storage facilities located within this State that are under 10 control of the certificate the direct supervision and holder. The fee therefor shall be \$600 a year for malt liq-11 uor only, \$600 a year for table wine only and \$600 12 a year 13 for distilled spirits only.

14 <u>All liquors stored in special warehouse storage facili-</u> 15 <u>ties shall not be subject to state liquor taxes until such</u> 16 <u>time as they are withdrawn from the special warehouse stor-</u> 17 <u>age facilities.</u>

18 Malt liquors and table wines withdrawn from the special 19 warehouse storage facilities by licensed Maine wholesale 20 distributors shall immediately become subject to the same tax and premiums as malt liquor and table wine imported into 21 State from out-of-state certificate of approval hold-22 this 23 All malt liquor and table wine products withdrawn for ers. distribution within this State shall be accomplished by the 24 25 procedure established in section 652.

26 <u>Distilled spirits may be withdrawn from special ware-</u> 27 house storage facilities by the State Liquor Commission.

Malt liquor, table wines or distilled spirits may be 28 special warehouse storage 29 facilities withdrawn from by authorized out-of-state purchasers and that certificate 30 31 authorizes the direct transportation of these products to the state border for delivery to such out-of-state pur-32 Products withdrawn by authorized out-of-state pur-33 chasers. chasers for delivery outside of this State shall not be sub-34 35 ject to the state excise tax or premium.

1	STATEMENT OF FACT
2 3 4 5 6 7 8	This bill allows the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages to license special state import warehouses for liquors. Liquor enters this country from most foreign countries by ship and at present all ports of entry are located south of the State of Maine. The importation will still remain under rigid control and should provide some employment for the State, as well as provide some taxable real estate in some area.
9 10	It is anticipated that passage of this bill would increase revenues by \$12,000 a year.
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
