8	§2953. Definitions
9	As used in this Act, unless the context otherwise indi-
10	cates, the following terms have the following meanings.
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11	<u>1. Loan. "Loan" means a grant of funds to defray the</u>
12	costs incidental to an osteopathic medical education under a
13	contract between the Department of Educational and Cultural
14	Services and an osteopathic medical student requiring either
15	repayment with interest or repayment in services.

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23	§2954. Authorization to Department of Educational and Cul-
24	tural Services; qualifications
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25	1. Authorization for granting of loans. The Depart-
26	ment of Educational and Cultural Services may grant a loan
27	to defray the expenses of the osteopathic medical education
28	of a student deemed qualified by the department to receive
29	the loan, upon such terms and conditions as may be imposed
30	by regulations of the department.
31	2. Limitations. The Department of Educational and
32	Cultural Services shall only receive, pass upon and allow or
33	disallow those applications for loans made by those students
34	enrolled or accepted by the New England College of
35	enrolled or accepted by the New England College of Osteopathic Medicine who are bona fide citizens and resi-
36	dents of the State, and who declare their intent to practice
37	as osteopathic physicians within designated areas of the
38	State.
39	3. Investigation of applicants. The Department of
40	Educational and Cultural Services shall make a full and

cations of each applicant and determine his fitness to 1 become a recipient of a student loan. The investigation of each applicant shall include an investigation of the ability 2 3 of the applicant and his parents or guardians to pay the applicant's expenses for an osteopathic medical education. 4 5 The department shall give preference to qualified applicants 6 who are unable, or whose parents or guardians are unable, to 7 pay the applicant's expenses in obtaining an osteopathic 8 medical education. 9

## 10 §2955. Contract terms; repayment

1. Amount; length of 11 time; declaration of intent. Each applicant who is approved for a loan by the 12 Department of Educational and Cultural Services may 13 be 14 granted a loan, in such amounts and for such periods as determined by the department with which to defray 15 his expenses incurred in obtaining an osteopathic medical educa-16 at the New England College of Osteopathic Medicine; 17 tion providing that the applicant file with the department a dec-laration of his intent to practice his profession as a li-18 19 censed osteopathic physician in areas of the State desig-20 21 nated as not being adequately served by osteopathic medical 22 practitioners.

23 <u>2. Amount; interest. The loans may not exceed the</u> 24 <u>necessary expenses incurred while attending an osteopathic</u> 25 <u>medical school or college and shall bear interest at the</u> 26 rate of 9% a year.

3. Contract. The loan shall be evidenced by a con-tract between the student and the Department of Educational 27 28 and Cultural Services acting on behalf of the State. The 29 contract shall provide for the payment by the State of a 30 stated sum or sums covering the costs of an osteopathic med-ical education and shall be conditioned upon the repayment 31 32 of the loan to the State, together with interest 10 years after the completion of osteopathic medical school and any 33 34 period of internship or residency required to complete the 35 student's education. 36

4. Repayment after failure to complete education. In
the event a loan recipient fails to complete his osteopathic
medical education, the department shall establish a period
of time, within 10 years of the date the student leaves
school, in which the loan must be repaid, with interest.

42 <u>5. Repayment credits. The contract shall provide that</u>

6 6. Rules. The department shall adopt rules to imple-7 ment the provisions of this section. These rules may pro-8 vide for the repayment of osteopathic medical student loans 9 in annual or other periodic installments.

10 §2956. Contracts; legal assistance; enforcement

11 The general form of the contract shall be prepared and 12 approved by the Attorney General and signed by the student 13 and the designee of the Commissioner of Educational and Cul-14 tural Services on behalf of the State. The department may 15 sue in its own name for any balance due the State from any 16 student on any such contract.

17 §2957. Fund created; method of payment

18 There is created in the State Treasury the Fund to Pro-19 vide Financial Assistance to Students of Osteopathic Medicine. All money appropriated for loans to osteopathic medi-cal students under this Act shall be credited to that fund, 20 21 and all payments of principle and interest received by the board shall be deposited with the Treasurer of State to the 22 23 credit of that fund. Interest earned from investment of the 24 fund shall be credited to the fund. All payments of funds 25 26 for loans shall be made upon vouchers signed by the Commis-27 sioner of Educational and Cultural Services.

28 §2958. Cancellation

## 29 <u>The Department of Educational and Cultural Services may</u> 30 <u>cancel any contract made between it and any student for any</u> 31 reasonable cause deemed sufficient by the department.

32 §2959. Reports

33 The Department of Educational and Cultural Services shall make annual reports to the Governor and to the Legis-34 lature, prior to each regular session, of its activities, 35 the loans granted, the names and addresses of persons to 36 37 whom loans were granted, together with a list of names and locations of practice of those students who have completed 38 39 their education and have become licensed osteopathic physicians in Maine, as a result of the student loan. 40
