These resources are available to the department to provide \$34,000 for alcoholism services in mental retardation programs; \$25,000 to Bangor Mental Health Institute; \$25,000 for Augusta Mental Health Institute for alcoholism services in programs in those institutions; and \$5,000 is for training in the existing homebuilders program.

31 STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment lists the programs which will be funded in whole or in part by the Alcoholism Prevention, Education, Treatment and Research Fund. It also recognizes that funds allocated in fiscal year 1982 may be contracted during fiscal year 1982 which will provide services in fiscal year 1982 and fiscal year 1983 by the Department of Educational and Cultural Services and the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation. Their fiscal year 1983 allocations were reduced to reflect this decision.
