The reports may include recommendations and outline issues which the Legislature and the departments may wish to address.'

## STATEMENT OF FACT

The Joint Select Committee on Alcoholism Services has carefully reviewed the programs suggested for funding by the Department of Corrections, Department of Educational and Cultural Services, Department of Human Services and Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation. The committee placed a priority on programs which emphasized prevention and education among different age groups and families and training within existing systems and services. The disease The committee of alcoholism is pervasive in our society. found that there are many varied programs serving different categories and groups. The committee found a need for an overall analysis of the system serving the public. The committee has, therefore, allocated \$50,000 to fund a comprehensive analysis of state funded programs and the establishment of a method of review and evaluation to make allocations from this premium fund more responsive to the needs of the public. The committee has provided one-time allocations to compensate some institutions for uncollectibles related to alcoholism programs for which they have not been reim-The committee will carefully review any special need for and effectiveness of programs for youth.
