Said The corporation shall be is managed by a board of 5 directors who shall be are citizen residents of Portland and/ or South Portland and who shall be are appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of his council for a term of 5 years, except that in the first appointment one director shall be is appointed for 4 one year, one for 2 years, one for 3 years, one for 4 years, and one for 5 years. Directors are chosen so that the residencies of the members of the board of directors are, as nearly as possible, in proportion to the corporation's rela- tive property holdings, based on fair market value, in the 2 municipalities at the time of the appointment. | 32 33 34 | making an appointment, the Governor shall consult with the city council of the municipality from which the director is chosen. The council shall nominate 3 candidates from among |

whom the governor makes the appointment. Said The directors
shall elect or appoint such officers and agents as they
shall determine are necessary for the transaction of the
business of the corporation.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

6 The purpose of these changes in the charter of the 7 Greater Portland Public Development Commission is to provide 8 local input on gubernatorial appointments of directors and 9 to provide that the composition of the board of directors, 10 in terms of the municipalities of residence of the various 11 board members, shall reflect the commission's relative prop-12 erty holdings in the 2 communities.

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
