	AN ACT to Increase Capacity at the Charleston Correctional Facility.
	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and
	Whereas, the number of persons who have been committed by the courts to the Department of Corrections exceeds the amount of space available to house them; and
	Whereas, the overcrowded conditions within the state's correctional institutions presents a hazard to both inmates and state employees; and
	Whereas, the Charleston Correctional Facility can be expanded quickly to provide additional accommodations; and
	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Consti-

1 2 3	tution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,
4	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

30 31 32 33 34 35	Because of the emergency cited in the preamble funds originally requested by the Governor in L.D. 1870 for the Charleston Correctional Facility have been placed in this legislation for fiscal year 1982 to allow for quicker legis- lative action. The funds requested would allow the expan- sion at Charleston Correctional Facility by increasing the
