<u>§1361.</u>	Definitions

1 <u>1. Manufacturer. "Manufacturer" means any person</u> 2 <u>engaged in the business of manufacturing televisions, radios</u> 3 <u>or phonographs.</u>

4 <u>2. Repair facility. "Repair facility" means any</u>
5 person engaged in the business of repairing televisions,
6 radios or phonographs in this State.

7 <u>3. Television, radio or phonograph. "Television,</u> 8 radio or phonograph" means television, radio or phonograph 9 equipment ordinarily used for personal, family or household 10 purposes, as well as associated components, including, with-11 out limitation, antennas, tape recorders, speakers, 12 headphones and remote control devices.

13 §1362. Warranty repairs

14 If a manufacturer agrees to require or permit a repair 15 facility to make television, radio or phonograph repairs 16 under a warranty created by the manufacturer, the manufac-17 turer shall comply with this section.

- 18 <u>1. Reimbursement. The manufacturer shall promptly</u>
 19 reimburse the repair facility for the following:
- A. Parts provided under warranty, at the price paid by
 the repair facility; and
- B. Labor performed under warranty, at the retail rate
 which the repair facility customarily charges for the
 same labor otherwise performed.

25 <u>2. Parts and service information. The manufacturer</u> 26 <u>shall make available to the repair facility, in a timely</u> 27 <u>manner, an adequate supply of replacement parts for and cur-</u> 28 <u>rent service information on any television, radio or</u> 29 <u>phonograph which the manufacturer agrees to require or</u> 30 permit the repair facility to repair under warranty.

31 §1363. Remedy

32 <u>Any repair facility damaged by a violation of this</u> 33 <u>chapter may bring an action to enjoin the violation and to</u> 34 recover its damages, reasonable attorneys' fees and costs.

- 35 §1364. Waiver prohibited
- 36 <u>Neither the duties imposed nor the rights created under</u>
 37 <u>this chapter may be waived or otherwise modified. Any</u>
 38 <u>waiver or modification is against public policy and shall be</u>

waiver or modification is against public policy and shall be
 void and unenforceable.

STATEMENT OF FACT

4 This bill requires television, radio and phonograph 5 manufacturers to pay their Maine service representatives for 6 warranty work at regular retail rates and to make available 7 an adequate supply of parts and service information.
