AN ACT to Equalize Health Insurance Benefits for Retired State Employees.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §285, sub-§7, as last repealed and replaced by PL 1981, c. 270, §1, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:
The State, through the board of trustees, shall pay the premium for Medicare, Part B, for retired state employees who are eligible for medicare payments.
Sec. 2. Appropriations. The following funds shall be appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act
