6 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P 2028, L.D. 2004, Bill, 7 "AN ACT to Permit Physicians' Assistants to Take Blood 8 Samples in Cases Involving Operating Under the Influence."

9 Amend the bill by inserting at the beginning of the 10 first line after the enacting clause the following: 11 'Sec. 1'

Further amend the bill in the 4th and 5th line after the amending clause (page 1, lines 23 and 24 of L.D.) by striking out the underlined words and punctuation "licensed physician's assistant or P.A.," and inserting in their place the underlined words and punctuation 'registered physician's assistant,'

18 Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before 19 the statement of fact the following:

20 'Sec. 2. 29 MRSA § 1312, sub-§7, as amended by PL 1975, c. 293, §4, is further amended to read:

7. Liability. No physician, physician's assistant, registered nurse or person certified by the Department of Human Services in the exercise of due care shall be liable in damages or otherwise for any act done or omitted to be done in performing the act of collecting or withdrawing specimens of blood at the request of a law enforcement officer pursuant to this section.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment corrects the statement that physicians' assistants are licensed; they are registered with the Board of Registration in Medicine. It also removes the abbreviation "P.A.," which although frequently used for physician's assistant may also be used for "professional association," "public accountant" or "physicians' association."
