Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the I lature do not become effective until 90 days adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, these statutory changes are being at the earliest possible time in advance of session; and	
Whereas, in the judgment of the Legisla these facts create an emergency within the meani	

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1 the Constitution of Maine and require the following 2 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-3 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 4 therefore,

5 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 6 follows:

18 Sec. 8. Transition clause. All legislative 19 officers currently serving a 7-year term shall con-20 tinue in office except that they shall serve for a 21 term to expire June 30, 1986, and terms thereafter 22 shall expire on June 30th of every 3rd year.

23 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited 24 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when 25 approved.

26 STATEMENT OF FACT

27 The intent of this bill is as follows:

1. To reestablish the existing office of Legislative Assistants under a director with related statutory duties;

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 2. To reduce the term for legislative officers
 32 and directors from 7 years to 3 years; and

33 3. To place all service agencies under the
 34 supervision of the Legislative Administrative Direc 35 tor.

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
