22	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
24 25 26	<b>29 MRSA §1752,</b> as amended by PL 1977, c. 32, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:
27 28 29 30 31 32	No person may operate or cause to be operated upon any public way a vehicle with a load of gravel, sand, crushed stone, rubbish or trash, unless the load is covered or otherwise secured or confined to prevent any portion of the load from falling from or spilling out of the vehicle.

1	STATEMENT OF FACT
2 3 4 5	This bill requires that vehicles traveling on public ways with loads of gravel, sand, crushed stone or rubbish be covered, confined or secured to prevent any of the load from spilling out of the vehicle.
