20 21	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
22	12 MRSA §7301, sub-§10 is enacted to read:
23 24 25	10. Suspension or revocation. Procedures for suspension or revocation of licenses to guide are as follows.
26 27 28 29 30 31	A. Whenever it is brought to the attention of the commissioner in writing that any licensed Maine guide, while engaged in guiding activities, has endangered the safety or general welfare of another person, the commissioner may conduct an investigation into the alleged incident.

B. Following any investigation as described in paragraph A, the commissioner may bring a complaint in the Administrative Court seeking to revoke or suspend the current guide's license of any person who he reasonably believes to have endangered the safety or general welfare of another person while engaged in guiding activities.

- C. If the Administrative Court finds that the person, while engaged in guiding activities, has endangered the safety or general welfare of another person and that the public safety or general welfare will be endangered by the person's retention of his license, the court shall revoke or suspend that person's license to guide for a period not to exceed 5 years.
- D. Any person whose license to guide has been revoked or suspended as the result of provisions contained in this subsection, may, after the expiration of one year from the effective date of the revocation or suspension, petition the commissioner for restoration of his privilege to procure such a license.
- E. If, after hearing on the petition, the commissioner determines that the public safety and general welfare will not be endangered by it, he may restore the petitioner's privilege to obtain a quide's license.
- F. If the commissioner disallows the petition and refuses to grant restoration of the petitioner's privilege to obtain a guide's license, the petitioner may appeal to the commissioner's advisory council which, after hearing, may allow the petition and restore the privilege.
