Till moot Moot till pi	No person, firm or corporation shall may, on the ord's Day, except on those Sundays falling between hanksgiving Day and Christmas Day; Memorial Day, the ast Monday in May, but if the United States Governent designates May 30th as the date for observance f Memorial Day or in 1985, whichever occurs first in ime, the 30th of May; July 4th; Labor Day, the first onday of September; Veterans Day, November 11th; hristmas Day and Thanksgiving Day as proclaimed by the Governor, keep open a place of business to the ublic except for works of necessity, emergency or tharity.

STATEMENT OF FACT

1

The purpose of this bill is to exempt those Sundays falling between Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day from the prohibition on Sunday sales in order to convenience the public during the Christmas shopping rush.
