IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE
AN ACT Concerning Fees and Costs Under the Dog Control Laws.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 7 MRSA §3452-B, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 492, §9, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
§3452-B. Use of fees retained by municipality
All fees retained by a municipality shall be kept in a separate account and shall be used to pay costs and salaries for animal control and enforcement of licensing laws or to support one or more approved humane societies, shelters or municipal or regional shelters. All fees retained shall be kept in a sep-
arate account. Any money not expended for these purposes shall not lapse but shall be carried forward to the next fiscal year.

Sec. 2. 7 MRSA §3459 is enacted to read:

§3459. Responsibility for payment of impoundment and other fees

When any dog is impounded and the identity of the owner of the dog can be determined by license numbers, certified rabies tag numbers or other positive proof, that owner shall, when properly notified, be responsible for payment of all impoundment fees, fees for distemper shots and all kennel fees.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purposes of this bill are:

- 1. To give animal control officers more funds to improve over-all animal control within the State by including impoundment fees, kennel fees, shot fees, vet fees and other fees in with license fees that are retained by a municipality; and
- 2. To provide that if the identity of an owner of an impounded dog can be determined, that owner will be responsible for paying all impoundment fees, distemper shot fees and kennel fees for that dog.
