Any person who applies for a Maine license to hunt with firearms ther than a juvenile license shall submit proof of aving successfully completed a hunter safety course is provided in section 7035, an equivalent hunter afety course or satisfactory evidence of having previously held an adult license to hunt with firearms in this State or any other state, province or country in any year beginning with 1976.
then proof of competency cannot otherwise be pro- ided, the person may substitute a signed affidavit hat he has previously held the required adult hunt- ng license or that he has successfully completed the equired hunter safety course.' Further amend the bill in section 4 in the last ine (page 2, line 37 in L.D.) by striking out the igures "1984" and inserting in their places the igures '1986'
