3. Penalty. Violation of this section is a civil violation, for which a forfeiture not to exceed \$500 may be adjudicated.

This bill makes it a violation of the motor vehicle laws for a vehicle operator to drive on a public way while wearing or using headphones or similar devices.

The potential hazards caused by insulating the driver from important sounds or signals has been recognized in states such as California, Illinois, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania, where similar utes are already in effect.

Title 29, section 1961, provides that bicyclists and others are "subject to all of the duties applicable to the driver of a vehicle," and thus would also come under the provisions of this measure.
