Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 30 MRSA §6209, sub-§1, $\mathbb{T} \mathbb{I D}$ and $E, ~ a s$ enacted by PL 1979, c. 732 , §1, is amended to read:
D. Indian child custody proceedings to the extent authorized by applicable federal law; and
E. Other domestic relations matters including marriage, divorce and support between members of either tribe or nation both of whom reside on the Indian reservation of the respective tribe or nation; and

Sec. 2. 30 MRSA §6209, sub-§1, \|F is enacted to read:
E. Violations of statutes or regulations governing the operation of motor vehicles, including violations of Title $17-\mathrm{A}$, section 360 , subsection 1, paragraphs $A$ and $B$, and Title 28 , section 1002, but not including Title 29, chapter 18-A, committed on the Penobscot Indian Reservation by a member of either tribe or nation.

STATEMENT OF FACT
This bill addresses an area in which the tribal court already exercises jurisdiction, but which the Penobscot Nation believes should be clarified.

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
