STATEMENT OF FACT

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Under our present workers' compensation system, about half of all risks are assigned to an assigned risk pool. Risks are assigned to the pool for several reasons, only one of which is high exposure, but rates for poor risks in the pool do not differ from rates for other assigned risks. Thus, better risks subsidize poorer risks, and there is no economic incentive to improve safety in the workplace. This bill surcharges poor risks in the pool and rewards good risks with a discount.

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
