29	§1401. Definitions	

1 <u>As used in this chapter, unless the context</u> 2 <u>otherwise indicates, the following terms have the</u> 3 <u>following meanings.</u>

4 <u>1. Discharge. "Discharge" includes leakage,</u> 5 <u>seepage or other release.</u>

6 <u>2. Hazardous materials. "Hazardous materials"</u> 7 <u>includes all materials and substances which are now</u> 8 <u>or hereafter designated or defined as hazardous by</u> 9 <u>any state or federal law or by the regulations of any</u> 10 <u>state or federal government agency.</u>

11 <u>3. Person. "Person" includes any individual,</u> 12 partnership, corporation, association or other 13 entity.

14 §1402. Immunity

15 Notwithstanding any provision of law, no person 16 who provides assistance or advice in mitigating or attempting to mitigate the effects of an actual or 17 threatened discharge_of hazardous __materials, or in 18 preventing, cleaning up, or disposing of or in 19 attempting to prevent, clean-up or dispose of any 20 21 such discharge, may be subject to civil liabilities or penalties of any type. 22

23 §1403. Exceptions

24The immunities provided in section 1402 do not25apply to any person:

26 1. Persons causing the discharge. Whose act or
27 omission caused in whole or in part the actual or
28 threatened discharge and who would otherwise be lia 29 ble therefore; or

2. Persons compensated for assistance. Who
receives compensation other than reimbursement for
out-of-pocket expenses for its services in rendering
the assistance or advice.

34 §1404. Liability for gross negligence or reckless, 35 wanton or intentional misconduct

1	Nothing in section 1402 limits or otherwise
2	affects the liability of any person for damages
3	resulting from that person's gross negligence, or
4	from that person's reckless, wanton or intentional
5	misconduct.
6	STATEMENT OF FACT
7	The purpose of this bill is to provide immunity
8	from civil liability or penalties for persons who
9	assist in mitigating or attempting to mitigate the
10	effects of discharges of hazardous materials.
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
