	Park in the City of Portland.

	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
	Sec. 1. Dedication of certain lands for park
	and recreational uses. The action of the city coun-
	cil of the City of Portland of January 3, 1983, dedi-
	cating the property described in this Act for perpet-
	ual use for park and recreational purposes, subject
	to ratification by the 111th Legislature, is ratified
	and approved. This property shall remain and be used
	solely for park and recreational purposes ir perpetuity.
	Sec. 2. Description. This Act refers only to
	that certain piece of land located in the City of
	Portland, commonly know as Fort Sumner Park, and de-
	scropp more particularly as tollows.

1 Beginning at a point on the westerly right of way 2 line of North Street, said point being S 19° 3 40" E, 429.32' from a monument marking the southerly right of way line of Walnut Street and said 4 5 westerly line of North Street; thence S 69° 42" W, 168.23' along a wrought iron fence and the 6 7 southerly line of Jacqueline Price as described 8 in deed Book 4404, Page 190, to iron fence an set in concrete; thence S 32° 11' 10" W. 9 11.73' to an iron fence post; thence 10 W, 9.90' to an iron fence post; thence S 66° 11 39' 30" W, 10.58' to an iron fence post; thence S 12 69° 05' 50" W, 10.29' to an iron 13 fence thence S 59° 53' 35" W, 10.21' to an iron fence 14 post; thence S 42° 23' 20" W, 12.58' to an iron fence post; thence S 4° 30' 50" W, 12.71' to an 15 16 iron fence post; thence S 3° 58' 25" W, 9.09' 17 iron fence post; thence S 11° 02' 55" E. 18 19 11.22' to an iron fence post; thence 10" E, 10.99' to an iron fence post, thence S 37° 20 47' 10" E, 11.38' to an iron fence post; thence S 21 40° 51' 20" E, 92.94' along a chain link fence to 22 a point; thence N 69° 49' 10" E, 201.23' along 23 24 the line of a chain link fence and then 25 said fence to a point on said westerly right of way line of North Street; thence N 19° 57' 40" W, 26 27 158.78' along said westerly right of way line North Street to the point of beginning, contain-28 29 ing 35,089 square feet.

Bearings are magnetic 1982 and refer to a plan by Larry Slaughter, surveyor of Brunswick, Maine, on file in the office of the city engineer in the City of Portland.
