STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to enable users of the Maine Turnpike to obtain commuter passes on a more convenient and judicious basis. Presently, commuter passes are available on a quarterly basis. A person must purchase the pass for the entire quarter. The Maine Turnpike Authority does not permit the commuter pass to be sold on a pro rata basis. As a result, a person who purchases a commuter pass on the 45th day of the quarter is required to pay the entire 90-day cost.

This bill does not create any additional costs or administrative problems for the Maine Turnpike Authority. The existence of monthly commuter discounts may actually increase use of the turnpike and increase turnpike revenues.
