STATEMENT OF FACT

5 Presently, retirement benefits under the Maine 6 State Retirement System are offered to more school 7 employees than those defined as "teachers" under 8 Title 5, section 1001, subsection 25.

9 The purpose of this bill is to recognize all those persons now covered and to include them under 10 the definition of "teacher." By making this change, 11 a "teacher" under current law will be prevented from 12 retiring and later returning to that 13 system or another system in a slightly different capacity while 14still collecting retirement benefits. 15

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
