STATEMENT OF FACT

2 Under federal law, airports must provide crash, 3 fire and rescue services. The cost of those services are absorbed by the local government running the air-4 5 although the State receives substantial reve-6 nues from the excise and sales taxes on aviation gas and jet fuel. These revenues go into the General 7 Fund. This bill provides that the State grant a par-8 tial subsidy to airports for the mandatory crash, fire and rescue services. Smaller airports, where 9 10 costs for these services are higher on a per passen-11 ger basis, would be reimbursed for no less than 30% 12 13 of these costs, while the 2 largest airports would receive no less than 15% of these costs. 14

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
