AN ACT to License the Harvest of Seaweeds.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6001, sub-§38-A is enacted to read:
<u>38-A. Seaweed. "Seaweed" means all marine algae.</u>
Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6801, as amended by PL 1981, c. 480, §7, is further amended to read:
§ 6801. Seaweed license
1. <u>License required.</u> It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in the activities authorized by

this license under this section without a current sea mess seaweed license or other license issued under this Part authorizing the activities.

4 Licensed activity. The holder of a 2. sea mess 5 seaweed license may take sea mess attached seaweed or 6 possess, ship, transport or sell sea mav mess attached seaweed that he has harvested for commercial 7 8 purposes.

9 3. <u>Eligibility</u>. A sea mess seaweed license shall 10 only be issued to an individual.

11 4. <u>Fees.</u> Fees for a sea mess <u>seaweed</u> license 12 shall be:

13 A. \$13 for a resident; and

14 B. \$25 for a nonresident.

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16 STATEMENT OF FACT

17 This bill is intended to create uniform licensing 18 of attached seaweed harvested for commercial purposes so that the department may gather data concerning the 19 extent of seaweed harvesting in Maine. The commis-20 21 sioner requires such information in order to aid in conservation of this resource, which provides a habi-22 tat for juvenile fish of several species. 23

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
