AN ACT to Reinstate the Authority of the Division of Eye Care to Carry out Certain Aspects of its Prevention of Blindness Programs.
Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

§3500-A. Jurisdiction of Director of Division of Eye Care, defined
Jurisdiction of director means having direct administrative responsibility for all programs and personnel under Division of Eye Care, sections 3500 to 3512, except including section 3501-A.

## §3501. Program established

The division shall provide a program of services for the blind, including the prevention of blindness, the locating of blind persons, medical services for eye conditions, vocational guidance and training of the blind, the placement of blind persons in employment, assistance to the blind in marketing the products of home industries, the instruction of the adult blind in their homes and other social services to the blind.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to reinstate the authority of the Division of Eye Care, Department of Human Services, to carry out the "medical eye care aspects" of its "Prevention of Blindness Programs," thus ensuring that a continuity of specialized resources is available to blind and visually impaired citizens of Maine, as well as those who are labeled at medical risk relative to potential loss of vision.

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
