## STATEMENT OF FACT

 This bill establishes a fund to be used for the building, remodeling and furnishing of quarters for the Supreme Judicial Court and Superior Court. It is patterned after the District Court Building Fund established by Title 4, section 163, subsection 3. Currently, there is no appropriation for this purpose and, when new justices are appointed, the expenses for the establishment of chambers as well as other necessary repairs and alterations to physical facilities occupied by these courts are taken from capital equipment funds of the Judicial Department. These expenses, often unanticipated, deplete the funds otherwise available for necessary capital equipment for these courts.

The Supreme Judicial Court and Superior Court occupy space in county buildings by provision of Title 4, section 115. The county governments pay into the General Fund \$764,000 annually by provision of Title 4, section 118.
