STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires that each District Court be available for small claims during evening hours at least one hour each month. The bill should result in no increased costs in operating District Courts. The Chief Judge of the District Court has authority to establish the hours of operation and may accommodate the requirements of this bill without increasing working hours or expending more funds.
