32 33	The right to terminate a contract, subject to the seniority provisions of any governing collective bar-

gaining agreement and after due notice of 90	days, is
reserved to the school committee or school of	directors
when changes in local conditions warrant the	elimina-
tion of the teaching position for which the	contract
