1 Whereas, certain obligations incident to the 2 operation of State Government make it essential that 3 legislative action be taken as soon as possible in 4 order that communities may initiate their grant 5 appplications; and

6 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, 7 these facts create an emergency within the meaning of 8 the Constitution of Maine and require the following 9 legislation as immediately necessary for the preser-10 vation of the public peace, health and safety; now, 11 therefore,

12 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as 13 follows:

Sec. 1. Block Grant Authorization. In accordance with the Revised Statutes, Title 5, section
16 1670, the State is authorized to accept federal block
grants in the following amounts.

24 Sec. 2. Block Grant Allocations. In order to 25 provide for necessary expenditures of State Govern-26 ment and other purposes for the fiscal year ending 27 June 30, 1984, the following sums, as designated in 28 the following tabulation, are allocated from revenues 29 derived from federal block grants. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, all federal block grant 30 31 allocations included in this Act shall be subject to the Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1585. 32

7 Sec. 3. Additional funds. Any additional funds that might become available due to implementation of 8 block grants and the possible overlapping of 9 other 10 grants shall be carried forward for future allocation by the Legislature or may be used to offset any pos-11 12 sible reduction in the block grants in sections 1 and 13 2.

14 Sec. 4. Adjustments to allocations. Allocations 15 may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget 16 Officer with the approval of the Governor to specifically cover those adjustments determined to be neces-17 18 sary under any salary plan approved by the Legis-19 lature and those reclassifications and range changes which have been approved by the Department of Person-20 21 nel and submitted for legislative review prior to the effective date of this Act. 22

23 Sec. 5. Encumbered balances at year end. At the 24 end of each fiscal year, all encumbered balances 25 shall not be carried more than once.

26 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency 27 cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect 28 when approved.

29 STATEMENT OF FACT

30 The purpose of this bill is reflected in the 31 emergency preamble.

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
