	Whereas, the 90-day period will not terminate ntil after the beginning of the next fiscal year; nd							
d d	Whereas, certain obligations and expenses incient to the operation of the Bureau of Alcoholic Bevrages and the State Liquor Commission will become ue and payable on or immediately after July 1, 1983; and							

1 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following 3 4 legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine follows:

Sec. 1. Allocation of fund. In order to provide the necessary expenses for operation and administration of the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages and the State Liquor Commission, the following amounts, or as much as may be necessary, are allocated from the revenues derived from operations of the fund.

- Sec. 2. Allotments required. Upon receipt of allotments approved by the Governor, based upon work programs submitted to the State Budget Officer, State Controller shall authorize expenditures from these allocations on the basis of these allotments and not otherwise.
- Sec. 3. Legislative intent. It is the intent of the Legislature that the allocation of funds by the Legislature, as provided by this Act, shall apply to the administrative expenses only and that these allobe allotted and approved under the cations shall Revised Statutes, Title 5. It is not intended to affect the use of the working capital, provided for

- Sec. 4. Adjustments to allocations. Allocations may be increased or adjusted by the State Budget Officer with the approval of the Governor to specifically cover those adjustments determined to be necessary under any salary plan approved by the Legislature, and those reclassifications/range changes which have been approved by the Department of Personnel and submitted for legislative review prior to the effective date of this Act.
- Sec. 5. Exclusion. Exclusive of the provisions of sections 1 to 4, up to \$50,000 for Capital Expenditures may be expended in each year of the 1983-85 biennium.
- 17 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited 18 in the preamble, this Act shall take effect July 1, 19 1983.
- 20 STATEMENT OF FACT

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- The purpose of this bill is reflected in the emergency preamble.
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
