STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to expand the number of facilities eligible to be repaired by vocational-technical institute journeymen electricians. These "student electricians" work under the supervision of a master electrician and do fully acceptable and competent work. By expanding the type of facilities in which these journeymen electricians can work, this bill provides them with more educational opportunities for "hands on" experience, as well as

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
