under present conditions, there is a very extensive and viable lobster fishery in operation in the areas that are being extensively dragged by scallop fishermen, resulting in unnecessary destruction of the lobster resource by the heavy dragging equipment being used by scallop fishermen.

Past experience has shown that scalloping and lobstering operations when carried out in the same area and time frame have caused serious "gear conflict" problems, resulting in lobstermen losing expensive gear and being forced to abandon very productive fishing areas.
