AN ACT to Set the On-premise Liquor License Eees in Accordance with Population.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

28 MRSA §701, sub-§1, as enacted PL 1975, c. 741, §21, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

1. Fees for full-year licenses. Fees for full-year licenses for the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premise consumption of liquor shall be as follows:
A. Class I License, spirituous, vinous and malt beverages:

In municipalities having population of 5,000 or
less......................................................... 600
In municipalities have population of over 5,000 .
…........................................... 750
(1) Class I-A License -- optional license -- for hotels that do not serve food spirituous, vinous and malt beverages:
In municipalities having population of 5,000
or less................................ 800

In municipalities having population of over 5,000 ................................... $\$ 1,000$
B. Class II License, spirituous liquor only:

In municipalities having population of 5,000 or
less ....................................................... 400
In municipalities having population of over 5,000
C. Class III License, vinous liquors only:

In municipalities having population of 5,000 or
less ........................................................ 160

D. Class IV License, malt liquor only:

In municipalities having population of 5,000 or
less $\ldots \ldots \ldots \ldots \ldots \ldots \ldots \ldots \ldots \ldots \ldots \ldots \ldots \ldots \ldots \ldots \ldots \ldots$
In municipalities having population of over 5,000

E. Class V License, Clubs -- without catering privileges -- spirituous, vinous and malt beverages:

In municipalities having population of 5,000 or

In municipalities having population of over 5,000


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Population shall be determined according to each Federal Decennial Census as shown by any official report authorized by the United States Census Act and shall apply to the licensing period next following that official report.

STATEMENT OF FACT
This bill provides for a reduced fee for onpremise liquor licenses in municipalities with a population of 5,000 or less.

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
